Rob Lott is Deputy Editor at *Health Affairs*, a multidisciplinary peer-reviewed journal dedicated to the serious exploration of domestic and international health policy and system change. Rob, who joined *Health Affairs* in January 2013, oversees the production and editing of the journal's special content, both online and in print, including *Health Affairs* Blog, Health Policy Briefs, Narrative Matters essays, Entry Point reports, and other journal features. Rob previously served as senior speechwriter at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, a position he held from 2010-12. In that capacity, he worked closely with Secretary Kathleen Sebelius and Deputy Secretary Bill Corr during the early implementation of the Affordable Care Act.

From 2005 to 2010, Rob held several positions on Capitol Hill: as a speechwriter and senior communications staffer for the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation and its chair, Sen. Jay Rockefeller (D-WV), as a speechwriter for Sen. Maria Cantwell (D-WA), and later for Rep. Rosa DeLauro (D-CT). Previously, Rob served as an editor and Dutko Fellow at the Democratic Leadership Council. Rob is a graduate of Tufts University.
