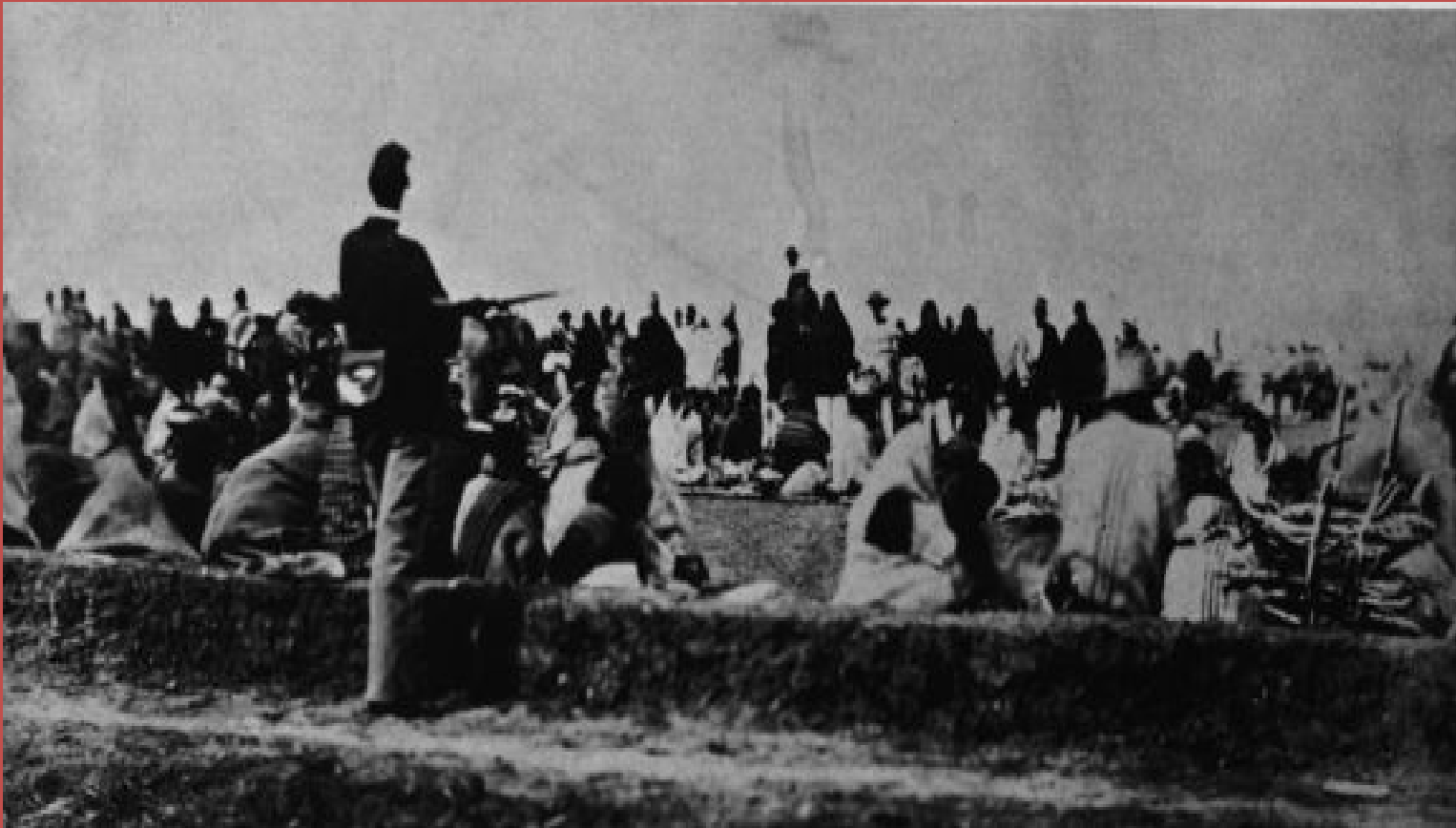

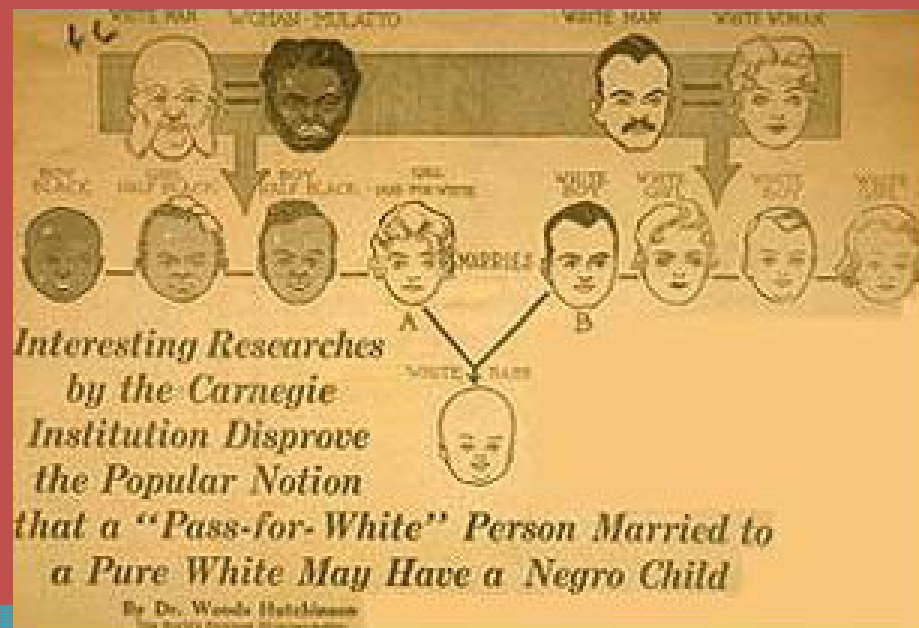

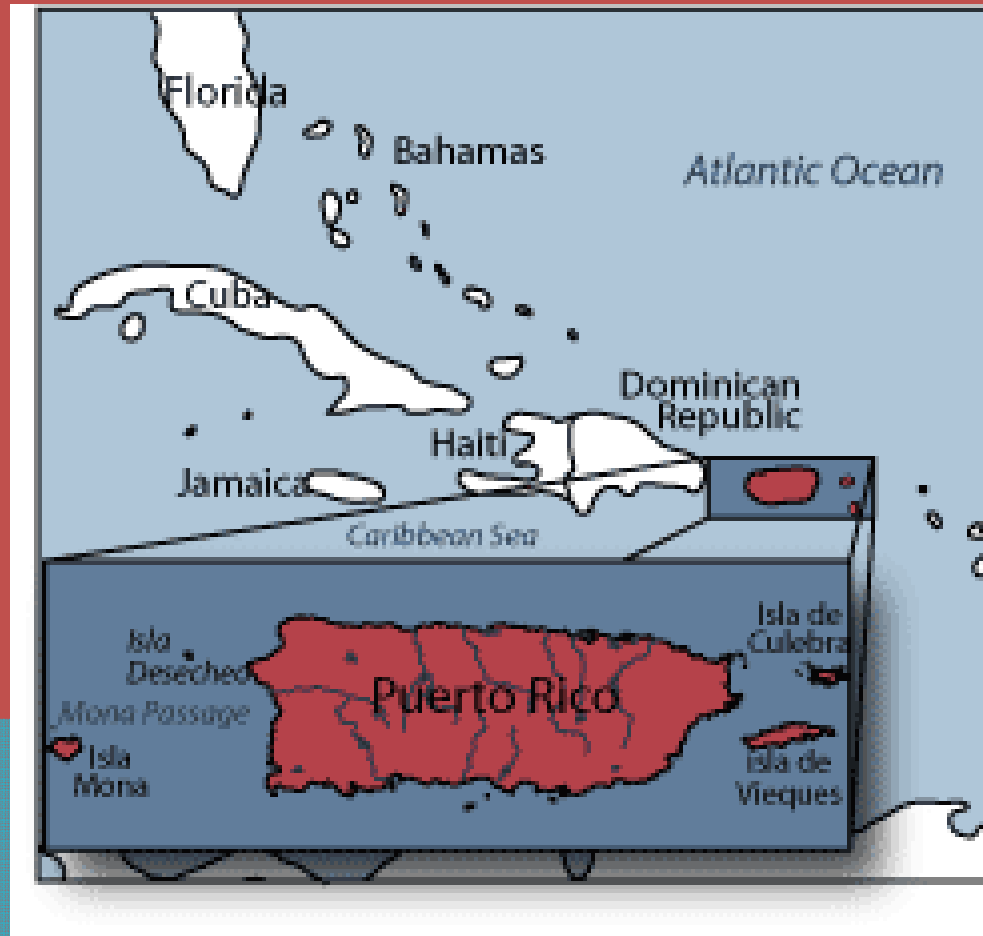

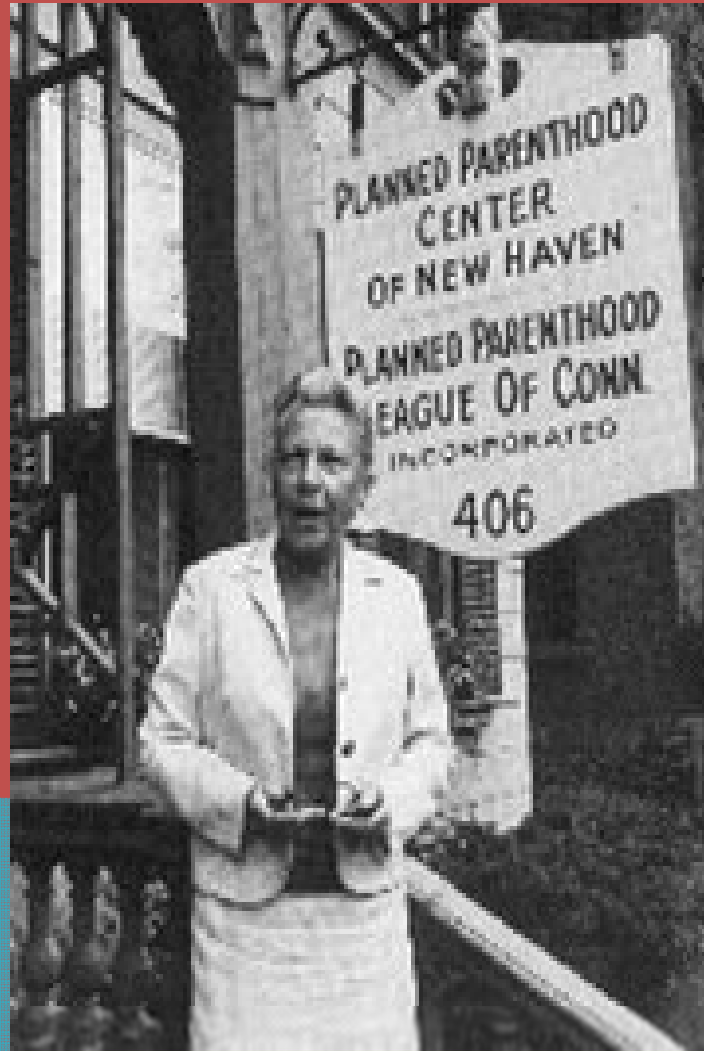

1965 MEDICAID AND MEDICARE PASSED

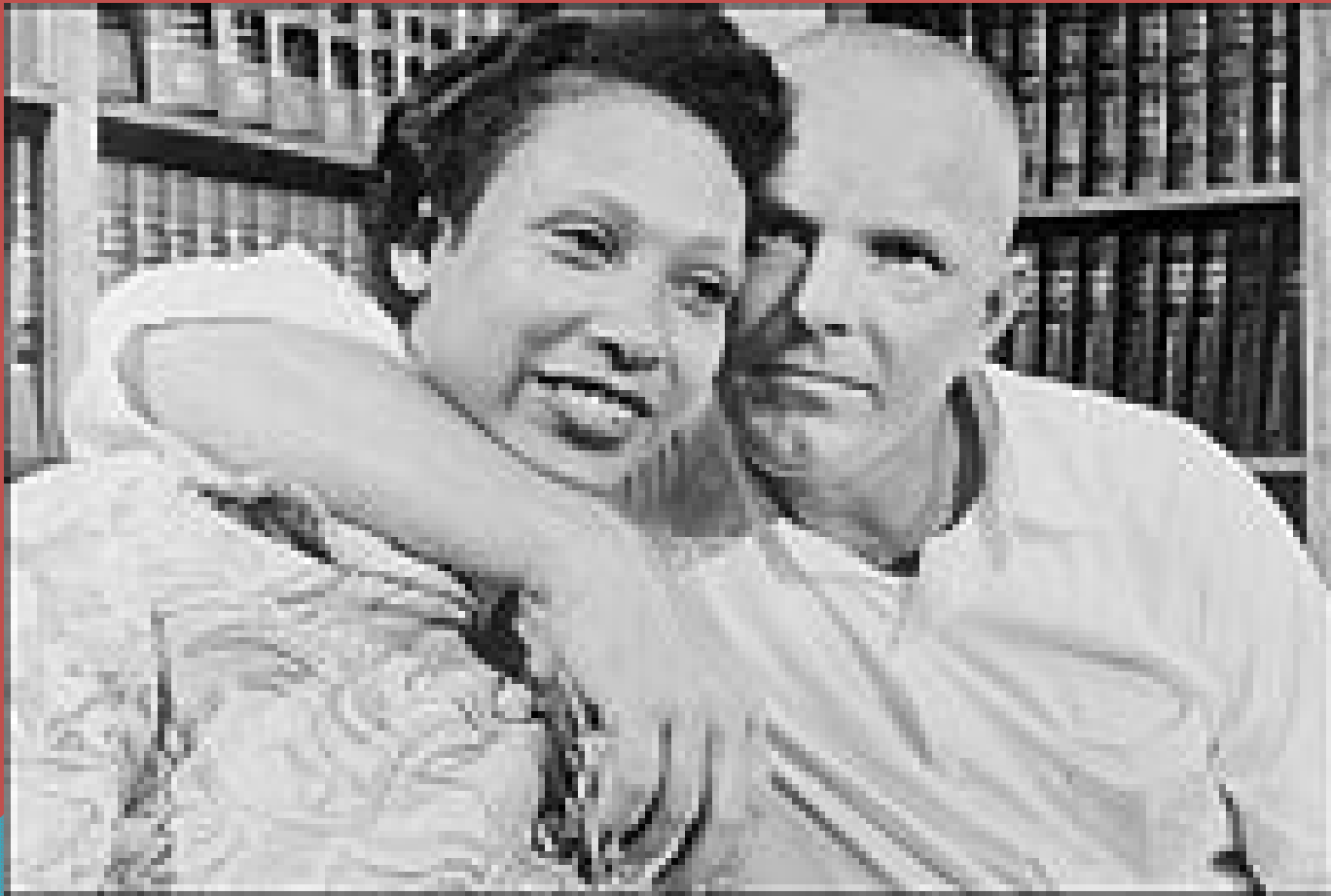

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22 — The Supreme Court overruled today all state laws that prohibit, or restrict a woman's right to obtain an abortion during her first three months of pregnancy. The vote was 7 to 2.

In a historic resolution of a century-old controversy, the court's decision was a landmark victory for women's rights advocates.

Apparent Heart Attack Comes as Country Mourns Truman

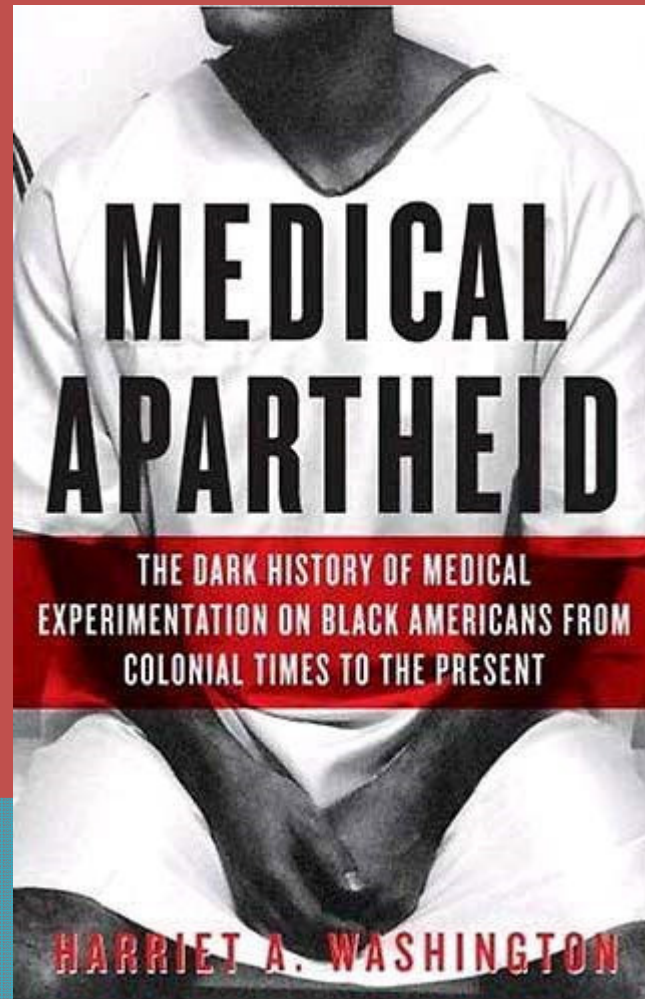

The 64-year-old Mr. Johnson, whose history of heart illness began in 1955, was pronounced dead on arrival at 4:33 P.M. central time at San Antonio International Airport.

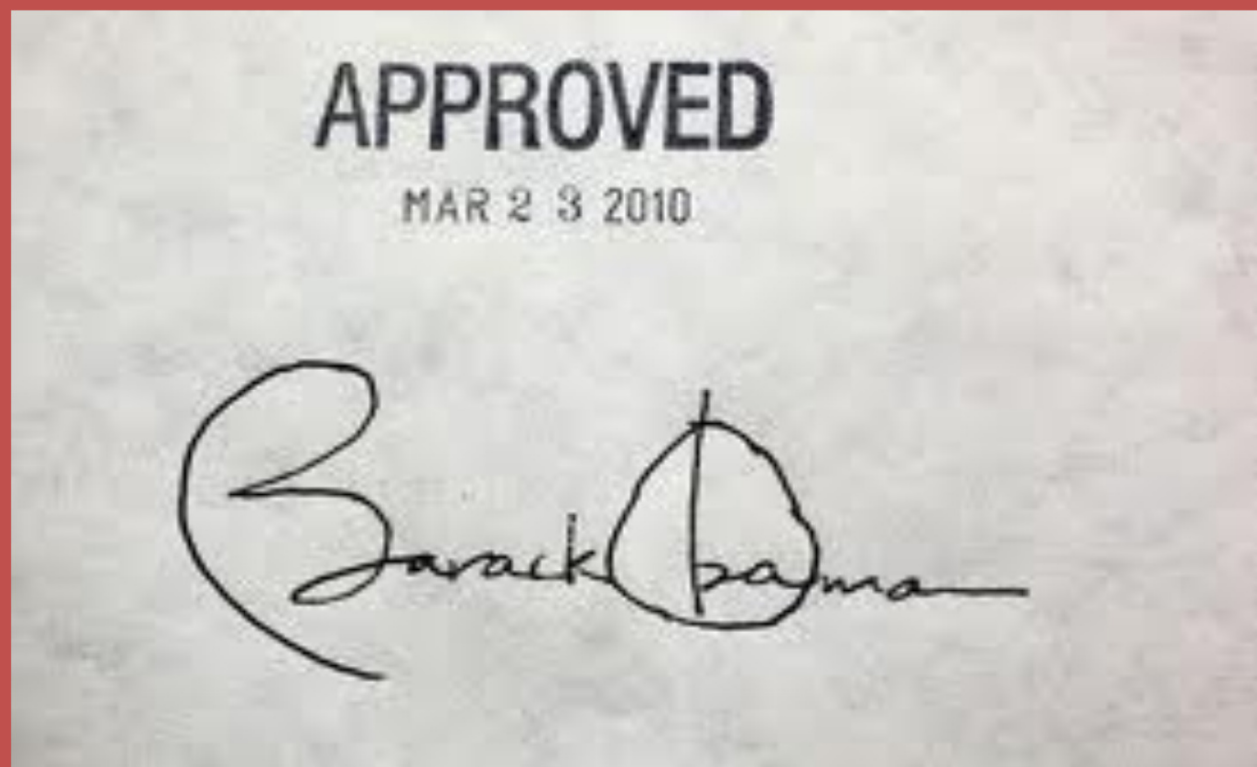

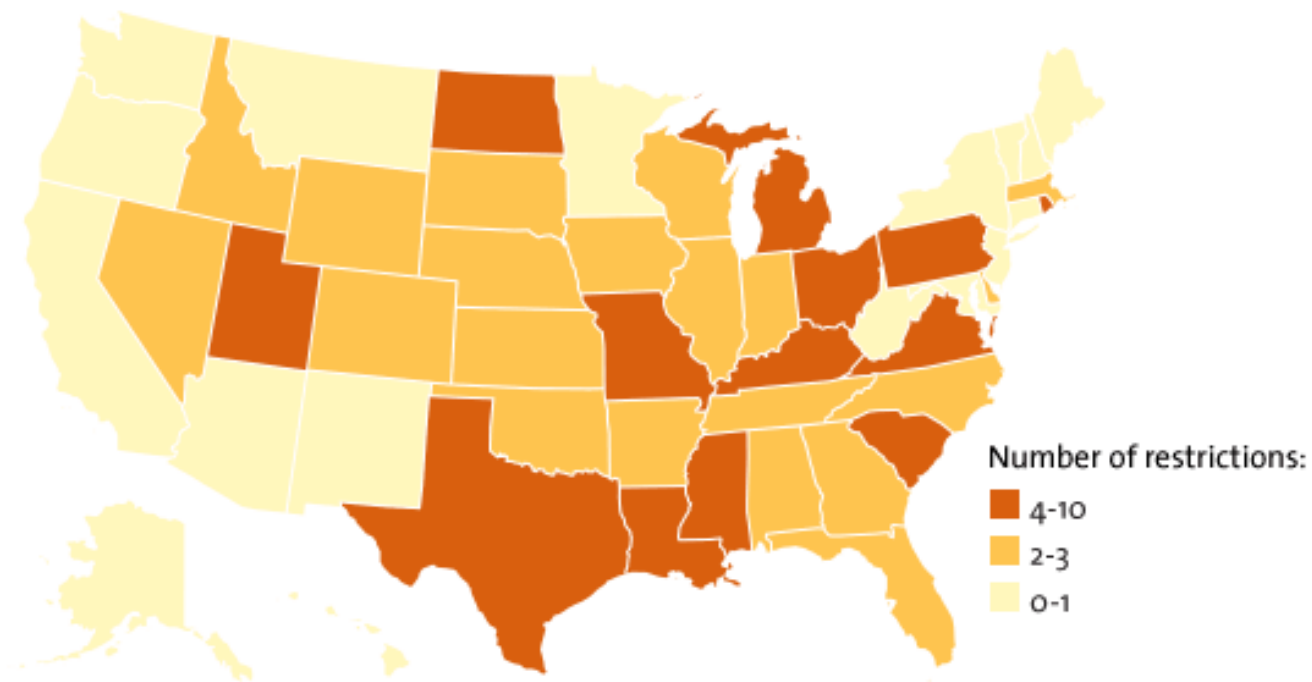

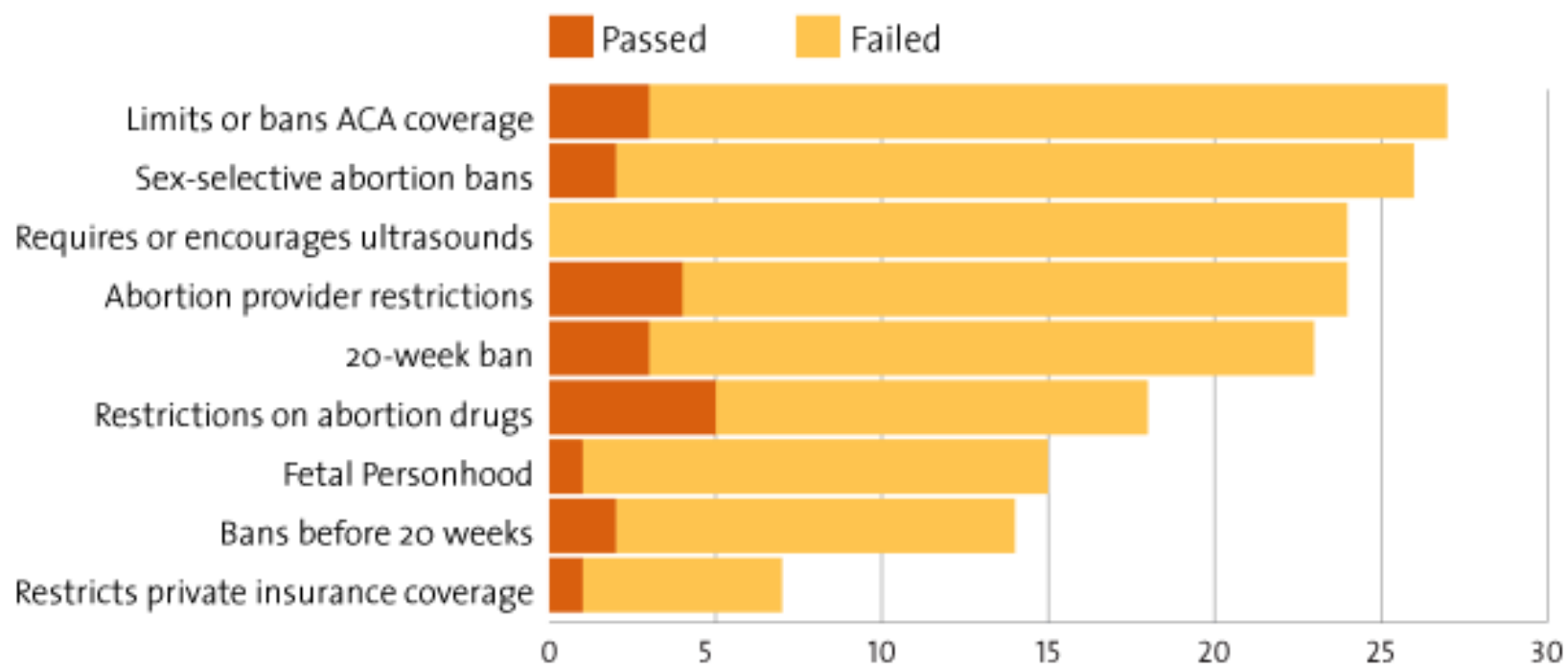

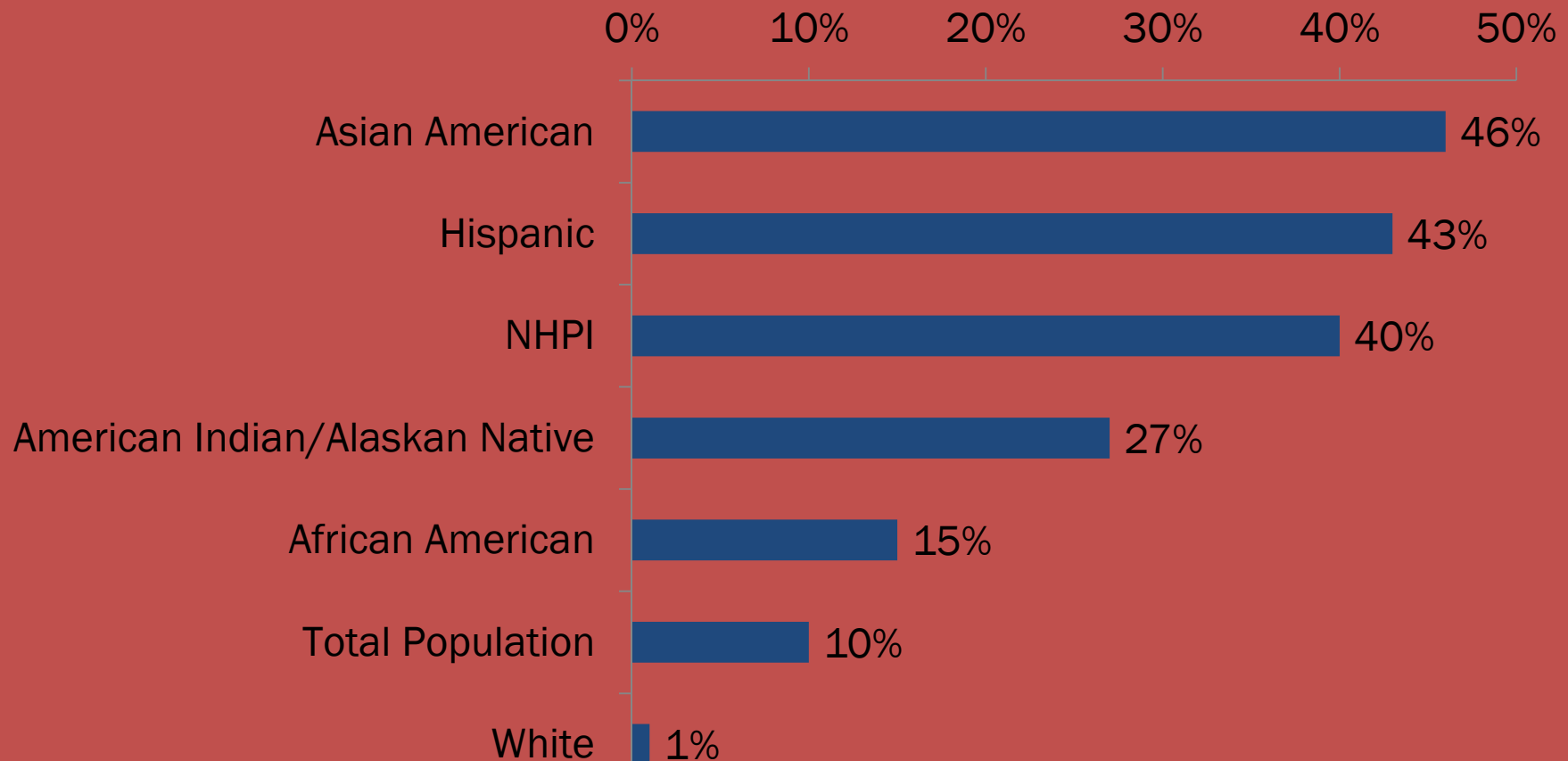

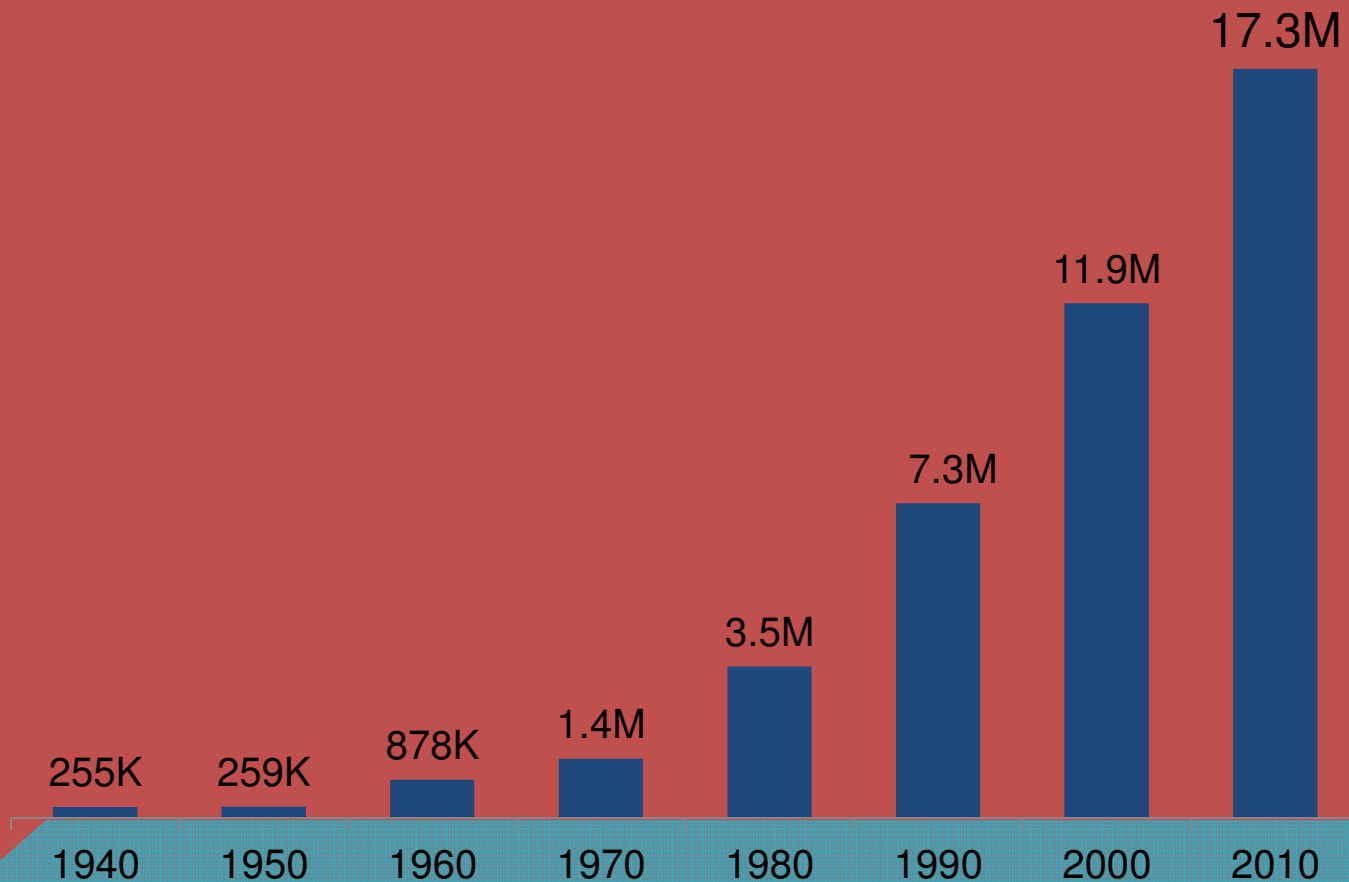

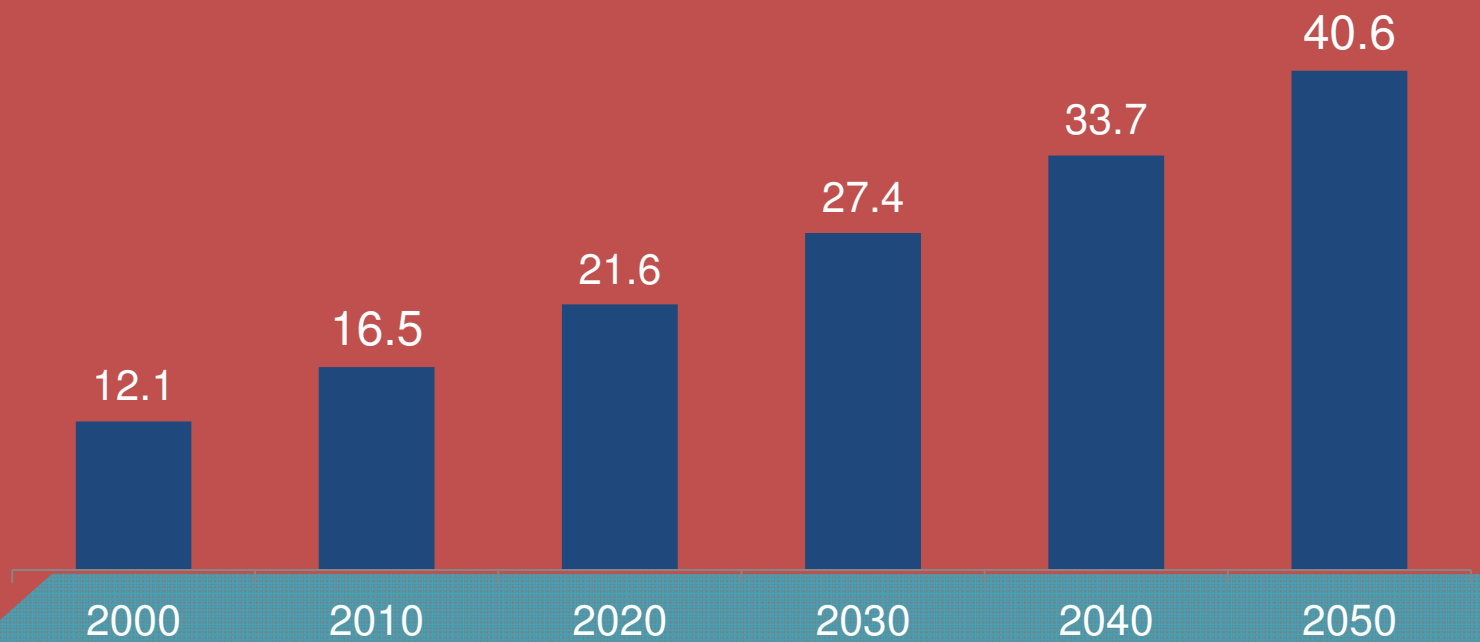

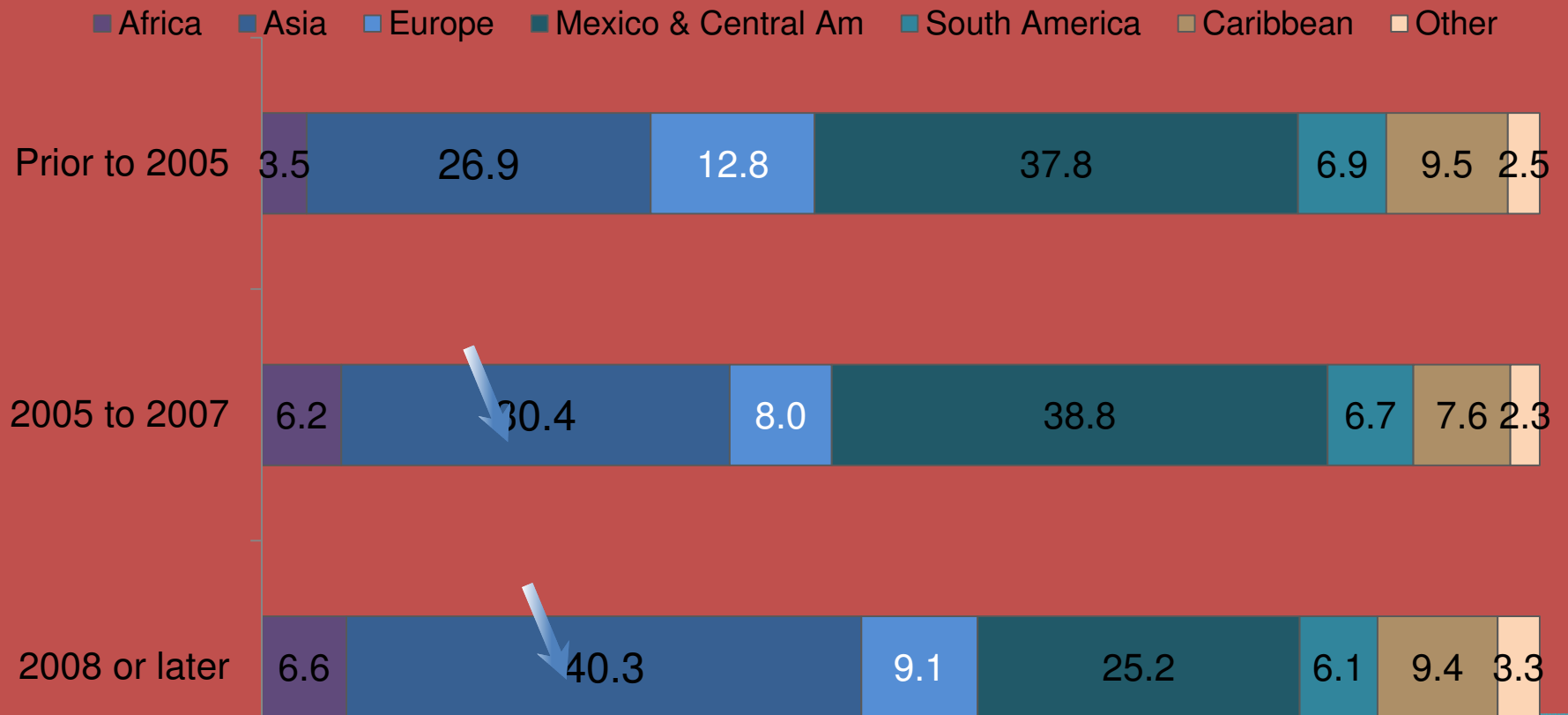
ASIAN AMERICAN POPULATION PROJECTED GROWTH, 2000-2050

Asian Am alone or in combination (millions)

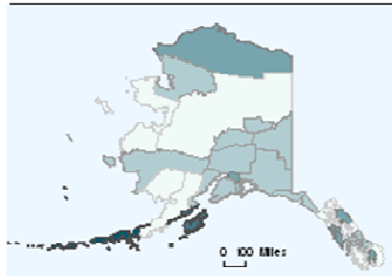

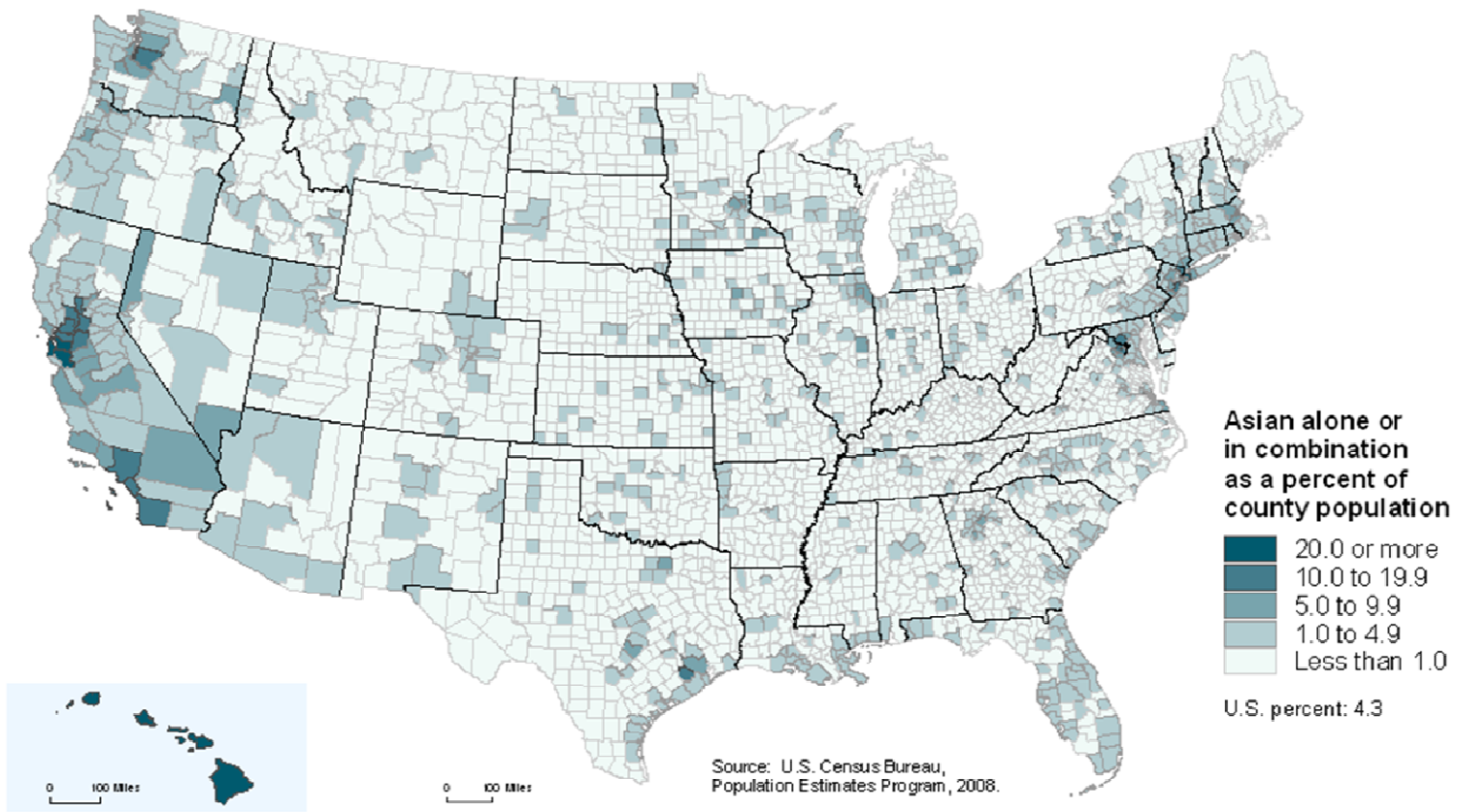

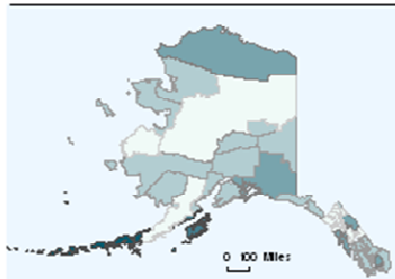

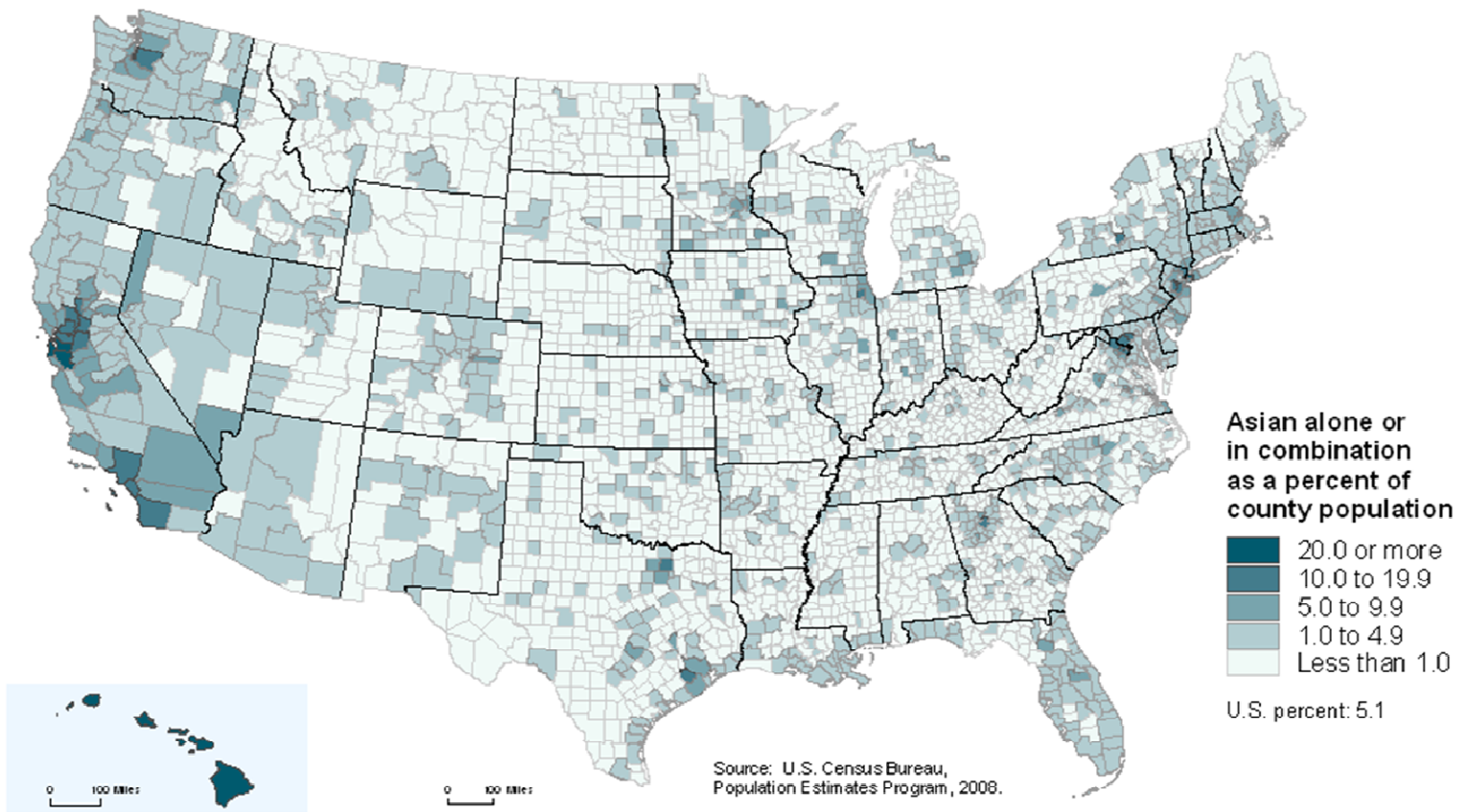


Percent Asian Alone or in Combination by County: 2000

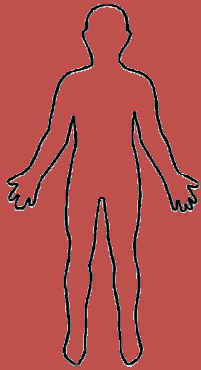

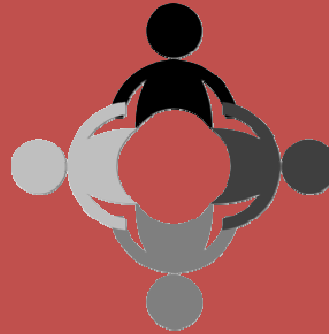
