Call to Order

Don Chen welcomed everyone, including the three new Board members present, and thanked Rini Banerjee, the outgoing Board Chair, for her leadership. The official business meeting was called to order at 8:37AM.

Approval of the Minutes

Don presented the minutes from the March 27, 2025 Board Meeting.

On a motion duly made, and seconded, the minutes from the March 27, 2025 meeting were unanimously approved.

Financials

Finance Update

Channon Lucas presented the organization's finances through March 2025 and highlighted that PNY's financials are strong in Q1 and there is 8 months in cash reserves. She noted that the Finance Team, which is undergoing a transition, is currently in the process of reviewing the budget. A budget modification will be presented to the Board in the fall.

Banking Signatory Resolution

Kathryn O'Neal-Dunham explained that as the new Board Chair and new Board Treasurer, Don Chen and Channon Lucas, respectively, needed to be added to PNY's JP Morgan Chase bank account. She outlined a Resolution to add Don and Channon as signers on the organization's bank account and then asked for a motion to approve this resolution.

On a motion duly made, and seconded, the Banking Signatory Resolution was unanimously approved.

Board Evaluation

Don thanked the group for high participation rates in this year's Board evaluation and noted that certain themes continue to be lifted by respondents: (1) navigating difficult conversations (2) focus on strategic conversations and (3) continued work on member engagement. Overall, the Board evaluation results indicate that the Board is working well, has a healthy Board culture, and is clear on what development and training is needed. Kathryn reminded the board that this year's open-ended question on organizational goals focused on member engagement. She emphasized the importance of the Board's role in engaging members, especially given the current short staffing of the PNY team, and thanked them for all their contributions in the effort. Kristen Ruff and Donita Volkwijn will be in touch with specific ways that Board members can continue to help with member outreach.

There being no new business and no need for an Executive Session, the meeting was adjourned at 9:01 AM ET.

**Following the business meeting, the Board Retreat commenced in which the Board undertook a discussion of risk tolerance scenarios, impacts on PNY, and potential responses. *On a motion duly made, and seconded, the Board voted affirmatively to pre-authorize the CEO of PNY to take certain actions in rapid response as listed in the attached Executive Pre-Authorization document.*

RAPID RESPONSE: EXECUTIVE PRE-AUTHORIZATION

In order to prepare a Rapid Response, the board members present unanimously agreed to pre-authorize the PNY CEO to take the following actions:

- Meet with any member who receives a federal inquiry or subpoena
- Make a statement to members on wrongful attacks on the freedom to give, and statements of fact
- Broadly affirm PNY's commitment to our "family" of individual and institutional members, philanthropic and nonprofit institutions
- Circulate a sign on letter, created by PNY, in solidarity with member under attack or government inquiry
- Host a Rapid Response Call to convene members
- Direct lobbying to support members' rights to give freely

Board Committee Charters

Note: Only the full board, the Executive Committee, and the Audit Committee have the right to bind the organization to decisions. All other committees make recommendations to the board.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee is responsible for providing strategic thought partnership to management and possesses the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the business of the Corporation between meetings of the Board.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Provides input and feedback to the CEO/President and Senior Leadership of PNY on strategy
- Reviews and discusses progress on the Board's internal equity commitments with committee co-chairs
- Designated members of the Executive Committee annually review the CEO/President's performance and make salary recommendations to the full board
- Votes on organizational policies, statements, and other PNY business of a time sensitive nature between board meetings (except that the Executive Committee may not approve changes that require a meeting of the membership)
- Does not elect new members to the Board, nor does it fill vacancies on the Board

Committee membership:

The Executive Committee is elected by the Board. The Executive Committee consists entirely of current board members. The Committee consists of the Chair (who also serves as the Chair of the Board), two Vice Chairs, the Treasurer (who also serves as the Chair of the Finance Committee) and the Secretary of the Board.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Audit Committee assists the board of directors in overseeing (a) the selection, retention, and performance of Philanthropy New York's independent auditors; (b) the quality and integrity of Philanthropy New York's financial reporting; (c) its fiscal controls and tax and regulatory compliance; and (d) compliance with its code of conduct.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Select and retain auditors
- Review the scope of the audit
- Review the audit results and present the audit findings to the board
- Review of the 990 before filing
- Annually review compliance with the Conflict of Interest and Whistleblower policies
- Contribute to the Administrative and Finance policies of Philanthropy New York

Committee Membership:

All members of the Audit Committee must be *independent members of the Board**. Members serve a two-year term, commencing in September each year.

*An independent member of the Board does not enter into transactions with or have any significant personal stake with companies that enter into transactions with Philanthropy New York.

GOVERNANCE AND NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The Governance and Nominating Committee guides the annual process of preparing a slate of candidates for the Board of Directors at their spring meeting and advises on board governance including the board evaluation and organizational bylaws.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Conducts the annual board nominations process, including interviews with nominees and second term board candidates.
- Presents a final slate of candidates for a vote of the membership at the Annual Meeting
- Advises on board governance including the annual board evaluation

 Makes recommendations to the board and membership for updates to governing documents, such as By-laws

Committee membership:

All committee members must be a current or former PNY board member. At least three members of this Committee must be current Board members.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee advises the Board on all financial policies and strategies. This committee reviews and recommends the annual budget to the board, monitors regular financial reporting, approves and monitors the organization's investments and insurance policies, and recommends significant financial policies for the board's approval. The Committee is established in the Bylaws as a standing Committee of the Board.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Annually reviews and recommends a budget for the board's approval
- Provides prudent oversight of the organization's investments, ensuring investments align
 with all organizational policies and approves changes to investments, as necessary, to
 achieve the goals of the organization's Investment Policy Statement
- Monitors the organization's insurance coverage to ensure adequate risk management
- Monitors the organization's 403B and ensures the funds offered meet the criteria outlined by the board
- Periodically reviews and recommends updates to organizational financial policies
- Selects investment and 403B brokers as needed to achieve the organization's financial goals

Committee Membership:

The Finance Committee is comprised of both current board members and member volunteers who have overseen and managed organizational budgets and investments. Members serve a two-year term, commencing in September of each year.

PUBLIC POLICY COMMITTEE

The Public Policy Committee advises the organization on public policy engagement and develops recommendations for organizational statements and action on specific legislation or proposed regulatory activity.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Act as a thought partner to management and the board around effective engagement with government entities.
- Annually review the organization's policy priorities to ensure alignment with the
 organization's focus on supporting a healthy and sustainable nonprofit sector. The
 committee recommends the public policy slate for approval to the board.
- Recommend specific policy actions for the board's approval, including issuing official public policy statements, leveraging PNY's support on sign-on letters and engaging in lobbying activity
- Acts as ambassadors to encourage peer participation in public policy and collaboration with the government

Committee Membership:

The Committee is composed of board members, member volunteers and nonprofit partners who have a strong understanding of the role of public policy in the philanthropic and nonprofit sectors. Ideally, Committee members have a sphere of influence at their respective institutions to effectively engage in policy and a strong commitment to advancing Philanthropy New York's policy priorities and strategy.

COMMITTEE ON MEMBERS

The Committee on Members guides the organization's efforts to cultivate an inclusive, purposedriven and diverse membership community. The committee acts as a thought partner and advisor to staff and the board on all aspects of the structure and strategy of member recruitment and engagement. The committee develops and makes recommendations to the board on policies that affect the member community. Committee members extend the reach of PNY staff by networking and building relationships with fellow and prospective PNY members.

Committee Responsibilities:

- Acts as a sounding board: Provides insight, guidance and feedback to inform staff and board decision making on organizational activities that impact members. Ensures that the organization's member policies align with organizational values.
- Serve as an ambassador for the organization: Extend the reach of board and staff to engage current and prospective members. Engage in outreach and listening to strengthen the connection between members and PNY.
- Advise and make recommendations to the board on Membership Policies: Provide input, feedback and make recommendations to the board about membership policies and practices, including eligibility, types of memberships and dues structure.

Committee Membership:

Philanthropy New York board members and member volunteers serve on the committee. The Committee strives to ensure representation of the range of types of philanthropic institutions and professional roles. Committee members serve two-year renewable terms for up to six years.
